



**REGULATIONS FOR SANITATION FACILITIES
FOR ALL EMPLOYEES THAT WORK OUTDOORS**

The Board of Health in the Town of Easton, Bristol County, Massachusetts, in accordance with and under the authority of Section 31 of Chapter III of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts hereby adopt the following Regulations at a meeting of the Board of Health held on Monday, September 9, 1996.

EFFECTIVE DATE : SEPTEMBER 16, 1996

PURPOSE: Adequate sanitation facilities for all employees that work out doors.

1. Any project or outdoor affair which requires outdoor work for a period of four (4) hours or longer per day shall provide sanitary facilities as approved by the Board of Health.
2. A permit shall be obtained from the Board of Health. The fee for the permit shall be \$5.00 payable to the Town of Easton.
3. The sanitary facilities(s) shall remain on site for the duration of the project or outdoor affair.
4. Separate facilities shall be provided for each gender and be clearly labeled.
5. The sanitary facility provided by the employer shall be serviced with the necessary accessories to provide proper use of the unit.
6. The sanitary stations shall be located every three hundred (300) feet.

PENALTIES: Failure to comply with these regulations shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00.
Each day in violation shall constitute a separate offense.
